



From the Pastor...

A few weeks ago, I received an e-mail from a leader of what used to be called a "moderate" Baptist organization in our state who wanted to connect me with a former Baptist pastor who had some years ago started a company that specializes in repurposing underutilized religious assets (churches) to be used as community resources. This company's tag-line is: "Repurposing religious assets for the common good." The idea I gleaned from the company's website is this: underutilized religious assets (churches) can partner with any number of "interfaith/

interspiritual" organizations to find ways for those assets (churches) to be transformed into community building resources that meet the social needs of the community. Their vision is this: "We see just, equitable, and sustainable communities emerging through sacred/civic placemaking."

I suppose the e-mail was intended to offer opportunities and encouragement to established or historic churches who are finding themselves with too much facility and too few members. As I read it, however, my heart went in a different direction. I was sad.

I was sad because of the lack of Gospel-centeredness of this endeavor. I'm not saying that our churches should not be fully engaged in the social needs of our communities and neighbors. Jesus is clear: we have a social responsibility for the poor, the oppressed, those who face injustice, the weak, the sick. Love of neighbor is equal, according to Jesus, to love of God. The church of Jesus Christ should be on the front lines of meeting these needs in our communities. But, what is missing in the approach that the e-mail from this Baptist leader offers is the most crucial element in meeting the real needs of our communities: the proclamation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

The greatest impact any church has in it's community is its proclamation of the Good News of Jesus. Now, as an "old-school moderate Baptist" myself (ask me what that means sometime), I'm not talking about a fundamentalist version of Christianity. I'm not talking about some hyped-up version of the Gospel that is either far too political, far too superficial, or far too judgmental. I'm not talking about churches that preach only part of the Gospel, or that use the Christian message to rally a crowd to be some type of hot-headed activists in the kingdom of this world. Yes, we do need to engage the social and political aspects of the world in which we live, but we do so always with the fullness of the Gospel in mind, not just part of it, and with the attitude of Jesus in our hearts.

But I stand by this statement: The greatest impact any church has in it's community is the proclamation of the Good News of Jesus. In our preaching. In our worship. In our ministries. In our outreach. In our discipleship. In our missions. In our social engagement. In our going. In our sending. In our doing, all of it. Proclaiming the Good News of Jesus as it is given to us in the Scriptures and with a reliance on the Holy Spirit is the only way to transform a society into a "just, equitable, and sustainable community."

Over these last three years at Calvary, we've seen folks commit their lives to Christ, renew their commitments to Christ, be baptized into Christ, and find hope and healing in Christ. We've heard testimonies from people who have been transformed by Christ who have struggled with substance abuse, emotional health issues, bad life choices, and tragic life crisis. Thanks be to God that God has seen fit to use our little band of believers to be a home for all of us ragamuffins. Why? I am convinced it's because we are focused on the Gospel... the telling and retelling of the story of Jesus who invites each of us into the community called the Church. It's an imperfect community, for sure, but when it is at it's best, it is by far the best community and is the best use of any assets available to it. So, let's keep using our assets for the bold proclamation of the Gospel. After all, that's why we are here. — Pastor Rendell


